### The First Lesson

1 Thessalonians 5:1-6, 11 (N.T., p. 205)

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, 'There is peace and security', then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! 

<u>Welcome Guests and Visitors!</u> We hope you already feel at home among us here at Stone Church. The nearest **restroom** is located between the Sanctuary and the Social Hall; exit thru the double doors at the front of the Sanctuary (near the TV). Everyone is invited for **refreshments** and fellowship in the Social Hall and on the patio after worship. We welcome the sound of any little ones during worship, but if your baby (age 0-3) gets too wiggly for you, you may take them to the **Nursery**, located in the hallway between the Sanctuary and the Social Hall. It's open each Sunday for children ages 0-3.

<u>Children's Church School</u> – Children meet in the Fireside Room at 9:30 am (stone building on the other side of the Social Hall). Children will come to the sanctuary to participate in Communion.

<u>Each Week, Stone Church Invites You</u> to share Holy Communion. We use the intinction method, dipping the bread in the cup—amber is juice, dark red is wine. When the time comes, we will process down the center aisle; take bread (in cup or cut – gluten free avail) and dip; the server will say a few words; partake of the moistened bread; return to your seat by the side aisles.

<u>Adult Ed</u> - (11am SA) – "Accounting for My Journey." For many Christians, church history can support their trade-tional faith. For Bob Fraser, that history before the Protestant Reformation, through Old Testament Judaism back to Bronze-Age Canaan, was a subversive revelation. Come hear how Bob discovered the courage through the history of our church to question orthodoxy and develop a faith that, while completely in line with Presbyterian liturgy, is unique to his ideology.

<u>Hurricane Relief Offering</u> – Session approved a congregational offering to occur this Sunday to provide relief through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. The damage from Hurricanes Helene and Milton is severe. PDA is our denomination's path to get funds and needed items to local groups in the affected area quickly and for a sustained time, as needed. The Peace and Global Witness Offering can still be given today; mark donation with the word "Peace." Your gift enables our denomination, the Presbyterian Church (USA), to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world.

Congregations can use up to 25% of this offering for peacemaking efforts that align with their passion. This year our StoneWorks Committee voted to send our portion to <a href="Covenant Presbyterian Church">Covenant Presbyterian Church</a> (PCUSA) in Springfield, Ohio. They are a welcoming, affirming congregation (whose Pastor went to McCormick Seminary with Rev Irene Pak Lee) of people from all over the United States, Haiti, Ukraine, Central and South America. Their city has been made more dangerous by political rhetoric, so our donation will be used by their mission committee to support efforts toward local peace.

<u>Taizé History</u> - The Taizé community was founded in 1940 by Swiss-born Brother Roger Schütz, son of a pastor and a Reformed Protestant. In the beginning, the Taizé community sheltered war refugees, mostly Jewish, who were escaping Nazi occupied France. It was part of the foundational belief of Brother Schütz that people from different countries and backgrounds could gather together to live and work together in kindness, simplicity, and reconciliation. At the heart of this belief was prayer for reconciliation of the Christian churches of the world.

Over time, the Taizé service evolved as one of simple singing prayer, mostly in Latin, and quiet periods of contemplation, so those of differing language and backgrounds could join. As a result, the Taizé community service has extended to mostly Protestant, Catholic, and Anglican churches in over 30 countries throughout the world, and has attracted tens of thousands of young people to participate in annual pilgrimages to Taizé, France. Together they participate in prayerful service but also focus on discussions to break down barriers, and prejudice between people and churches.

The church in Taizé, France, is now named The Church of Reconciliation.

Stone's candlelight Taizé services at Stone Church are held the first Tuesday of the month. Sanctuary doors open at 6:30 pm and the service is from 6:45 - 7:30 pm. During Advent and Lent services are held every Tuesday during those seasons. Our next Taizé service will be Tuesday, November 5<sup>th</sup>.

How/why did Taizé start at Stone in 1998? That history will be in next week's bulletin!
