Mark 16:1-8 (N.T., p. 54)

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. No Children's Sunday School Today; the nursery is open; children 3 and under are welcome. In the Sanctuary entry (Narthex) there are some activities for children to use during worship. All children are invited to participate in the Children's sermon.
