

<u>Welcome Guests and Visitors!</u> We hope you already feel at home among us here at Stone Church. The nearest **restroom** is located between the Sanctuary and the Social Hall; exit thru the double doors at the front of the Sanctuary (near the TV). Everyone is invited for **refreshments** and fellowship in the Social Hall and on the patio after worship. We welcome the sound of any little ones during worship, but if your baby (age 0-3) gets too wiggly for you, you may take them to the **Nursery**, located in the hallway between the Sanctuary and the Social Hall. It's open each Sunday for children ages 0-3.

<u>Children's Church School</u> – Children meet in the Fireside Room (stone building on the other side of the Social Hall). Children will come to the sanctuary to participate in Communion.

Each Week, Stone Church Invites You to share Holy Communion. We use the intinction method, dipping the bread in the cup—amber is juice, dark red is wine. When the time comes, we will process down the center aisle; take bread (in cup or cut – gluten free avail) and dip; the server will say a few words; partake of the moistened bread; return to your seat by the side aisles.

<u>The Retable Floral</u> is dedicated in memory of the life and times of Rev. George Erickson.

<u>Todays' Choral Selections</u> all focus on the joy of raising our voices in song. Whether you sing in our choir, in the congregational hymns, or in the shower, your voice is uniquely yours, and using it in worship is a joyful and meaningful activity. I invite you to sing with us in the choir this year: singing is healthful, enjoyable, enriching, and meditative. With all these good things--as our offertory anthem says--how can you keep from singing?

If you are an enthusiastic singer, or a novice, and want to join a vibrant church choir, you're invited to come sing choral masterworks by composers such as Handel, Mendelssohn, Brahms, Lauridsen, Fauré, Rutter, and other contemporary sacred music composers. Our choir director is Nancy Wait Kromm—Associate Professor of Music at Santa Clara University, soprano performer, and a private voice instructor. Our choir offers a rewarding musical experience.) <u>Anointing & Prayer</u> – (2nd Sundays) - After worship, come to the front of the Sanctuary (near the piano) for anointing from Rev. Dr. David McCreath; an opportunity for a moment of personal prayer and anointing.

<u>Liturgical Arts Invitation</u> - Many hands are needed for the interesting projects of the Liturgical Arts group. come together to make peace; and the traditional white cranes on the front wall of the Sanctuary remember the twelve year old Sadako Sasaki of Hiroshima, who famously completed her goal of folding 1000 "peace cranes" before dying of leukemia in 1955.
